Dear Parents and Guardians,

1. School Admin Day

All students <u>will not be required to attend school</u> on Friday, 8 November, as it is a day designated for teachers to complete students-related administrative work.

2. Promotion Day

Promotion Day is scheduled on Monday 11 November. Ensuring the safety and well-being of our children online is a shared responsibility, and fostering good cyber habits is especially important during this time. Your active involvement in your child's or ward's online activities is a crucial step in nurturing their well-being and creating a positive digital experience.

8. School Holiday Advisory

As the year-end holidays approach, the Singapore Police Force, Central Narcotics Bureau, National Crime Prevention Council and National Council Against Drug Abuse have jointly issued an advisory for parents and students. Key advisories for students include avoiding shop theft, high-rise littering and dangerous behaviours like speaking to strangers or engaging in online conversations with untrusted individuals. Parents are also reminded to talk to their children about the risks of vaping, which is illegal and harmful. Stay vigilant against scams by using the ScamShield app, and always prioritise your child's safety by discussing peer pressure and stranger danger. Annex B

With the year-end school holidays approaching, it is essential for parents to guide children in becoming responsible digital citizens. Key Elements of Cyber Citizenship:

- Respectful Communication: Foster empathy and kindness in children's online interactions. Remind them that their digital words and actions have real-world consequences.
- 3. **Digital Footprint Awareness**: Help children understand the permanence of online posts. Developing a habit of careful consideration before posting or sharing content will benefit them in the future.
- 4. **Screen Time Balance**: With more free time during the holidays, set reasonable screen time limits and encourage offline activities to ensure a balanced lifestyle.
- 5. **Critical Thinking**: Equip children with skills to evaluate online information, distinguish credible sources from unreliable ones, and recognise misinformation.

Parents play a vital role in nurturing positive digital habits. Simple steps like having open conversations about online activities, designating device-free times for family bonding, and modelling mindful screen use make a meaningful difference.
